

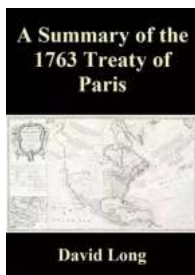

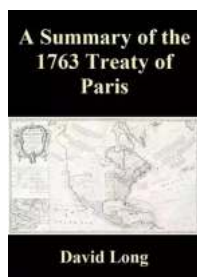

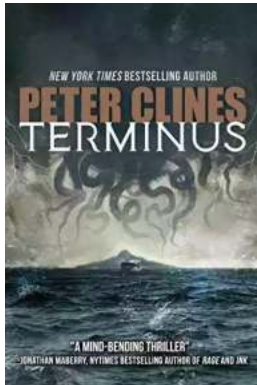

The treaty was signed on behalf of the kings of Britain, France, Spain, and Portugal. The respective monarchs of these kingdoms at the time were George III, Louis XV, Charles III, and Joseph I.

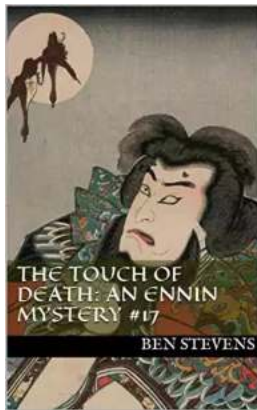
The treaty was negotiated and signed by 3 representatives of the 3 major powers involved in the treaty- Duke Bedford of Britain, Duc de Praslin of France, and Duke Grimaldi of Spain. John Russell, the 4th Duke of Bedford (1710-71) was a British politician, statesman and diplomat who served in the British Parliament. Cesar Gabriel de Choiseul, duc de Praslin (1712-85) was a French army officer, diplomat and statesman. Jeronimo Grimaldi, 1st

Duke of Grimaldi (c.1720-89), was an Italian-born Spanish diplomat and politician.



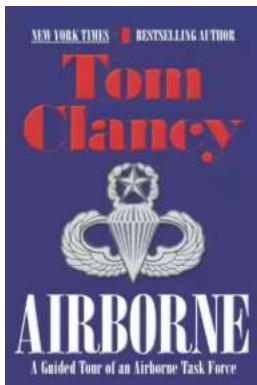
